Hi Blues Fans,

As I write this month's letter to the membership, I'm thinking what a lucky person I am. I have a great group of people working with me at the Washington Blues Society! The Board of Directors and Committee Members volunteer their time

and talents because they have a passion for music. Blues music specifically! We work hard to serve the members of the society and our communities. Our membership truly directs our activities by being actively involved in expressing their opinions and ideas to us. This past few months I have received a lot of questions from members and non-members as to how the Best of the Blues Awards process works. So I thought I would take a few minutes and explain the process.

The Board of Directors does not select the nominees! That is done by the members when they fill in their nomination ballots. It is one of the perks of membership. We receive lots of these ballots and compile all the nominees and how many nominations they each receive, a long and time-consuming task. These are then double checked so that every nomination gets noted. Generally, there are many people, bands, events, clubs, etc. that receive nominations. However, we usually just list the top three to four in each category on the final ballot. If we listed everyone who got a nomination the ballot would be ten to fifteen pages long and very confusing. This has been the practice at the Washington Blues Society since before I volunteered, and it makes sense as the cost alone of printing those ballots would be prohibitive. We are a non-profit and our Board works with limited resources. I know it seems the same people get nominated, but our members recognize new talent, too! Brett Benton, Dave Miller, John Greyhound Maxwell, and many others who moved to our state and were recognized and nominated by the membership! I personally believe it is an honor to be nominated as the nomination ballot is just categories and blank lines, it means something when the membership remembers your name and writes it in! From all of that the final ballot is created and then the final vote is then totaled and we find out the results at the awards show. One of the favorite events of the membership as shown by their attendance. Next month, I'll share more about all the work the Board of Directors as we have many events, projects, etc. that we are doing for our membership.

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

Hi Bluesletter Readers,

After exchanging several emails with him, I learned that we have several people in common along the blues trail, such as Atlanta-based publicist Mark Pucci and Alligator Records founder Bruce Iglauer.

This month, Nick has a preview of Tinsley Ellis' return to the Pacific Northwest and British Columbia and I hope that Bluesletter readers will check out this road-testing Alligator Records artist.

This issue also includes a preview of a very special benefit concert to not only honor those lost to HIV/AIDS, but also raise awareness through a 545-mile bike ride from San Franciso to Los Angeles. Local promoter, and HIV/AIDS survivor, Rad Justice has led this effort and Washington Blues Society Vice President Rick J. Bowen offers up a preview to what will be a true highlight of this blues year. Blues for the Ride features award-winning Rose City blueswoman Karen Lovely and a perennial Washington Blues Society Best of the Blues Awards ("BB Awards") favorite, the Stacy Jones Band.

This year also begins the 31st year of the Washington Blues Society, and from time to time throughout 2020, we will glance backward at the early days of our blues society in the pages of this magazine.

This issue also honors this year's class of Blues Foundation Hall of Fame honorees, which will be inducted one night before this year's Blues Music Awards. I've also included a list of the 2020 Blues Music Awards nominees to inform Bluesletter readers about this important Blues Foundation annual event. I am planning my return to this year's Blues Music Awards in May and look forward to reconnecting with my extended blues family in Memphis. Since my last trip to Memphis, Hilton has a new Curio property in the former Amtrak station one block south of the Hall of Fame and I look forward to staying there and learn about the history of that neighborhood.

Every April, Gary Grape coordinates one of the year's earliest festivals. The Gray Sky Blues Music Festival has been a long-running event held in conjunction with the Daffodil Festival, an annual celebration of the history and traditions in four Pierce County cities: Tacoma, Puyallup, Sumner, and Orting.

Finally, regular readers will notice that Little Bill Englehart's column is missing from this issue. Last month, Little Bill wrote me in an email that "It is now the new players' turn. I will be retiring at the end of this year. What started in my dad's garage in 1957, will end with my last show in Tacoma in the Spanish Ballroom at McMenamins in December."

After actively playing music since 1957 - one year before I was born - Little Bill Engelhart is settling down. This month, I've tried to capture Little Bill in words going back to the first time I saw him play a Downtown Seattle Association lunch concert near my former office at the US Department of Labor Administration. Since then, I've seen him at festivals, concert halls and taverns and one thing always remained the same: A Little Bill show, whether he was playing as a duo with Rod Cook or with a full line-up of his legendary Blue Notes, each set was diverse, unpredictable (and perhaps most importantly, danceable). However, I'm not ready to think of Little Bill as "retired" just yet. Little Bill has booked several great shows booked in March, April and May.

Until next month, go out and see live blues!

A Very Special Thanks to Little Bill...

Observations on enjoying Little Bill on stage & in the Bluesletter.

My first Little Bill and the Blue Notes show was at a lunchtime concert sponsored by the Downtown Seattle Association at 3rd Avenue and Seneca Streets in downtown Seattle in 1998. I had started a new position at the US Department of Labor working with federal job training grants to states and community organizations and recognized several of the songs as I unpacked my lunch.

This band was tight. I don't remember who joined Little Bill that day. He joked with my co-workers, smoothly transitioned from song to song and transformed this courtyard into a juke joint. When I returned to my desk, his late 1950s single on Seattle's Dolton Records, "I Love an Angel," stuck in my mind. I later learned that "I Love an Angel" made the Billboard Hot 100 and was featured on the Dick Clark's American Bandstand. This was quite an achievement for a young bluesman with polio as a unique, guitar-fueled style of rock and roll launched out of Tacoma on AM radio.

Over the years, I've seen Little Bill lead the Blue Notes, play with Rod Cook as a duo or add drummer Russ Kammerer as a trio. One very special night was his 70th birthday at the Rialto Theatre in Tacoma. In that whirlwind of several birthday shows that year that included proclamations from Washington's governor, Tacoma's mayor and the Pierce County executive, Little Bill was not the brusque curmudgeon that several blues friends described to me. He was gracious and genuinely touched by the accolades from "The Man" and fans alike as well as the exceptional Big Blues for Little Bill: A Tribute to The Music of Little Bill *Engelhart* compilation CD.

Several years later, he began contributing a monthly column to both the South Sound Blues Association website and the Bluesletter. I was (and still am) thrilled to publish Little Bill's exploits on-the-road in California, Nevada and Alaska. His stories of "the wrong side of the tracks" in his native Tacoma are informative and funny and his tributes honoring his blues friends who have passed are touching.

One month, either I forgot to send Little Bill a reminder about our deadline or just simply missed his story. A few days after the Bluesletter landed in members' mailboxes, I got an urgent email from Little Bill.

"Hey, Eric. What's up? Am I fired?"

"Uh oh," I thought. "Me? Fire Little Bill?"

I could never do that.


After quickly searching my email accounts, I apologized profusely for my mix-up. Thankfully, his next story landed in my in-box just before deadline the following month.

A Quitter Never Wins

Previewing Tinsley Ellis' March 2020 Pacific Northwest Shows By Kirk Anderson (Photo by Ian Rawn)

"A singular blues legend will be taking four stages in our Pacific Northwest community in mid March as part of another of his World tours. He'll walk out on stage in front of his 1967 Gibson Vintage Burst ES-345, his 1959 Sunburst Fender Stratocaster with its beautiful deep rosewood fret board and his 1973 Gibson Les Paul Cherry Sunburst Deluxe to name a few. Tinsley says, "If you want to sound classic, use the instruments that the old masters used"

"A Quitter Never Wins" is a signature song written by Tinsley and Margaret Sampson. Tinsley released this hit on his fifth studio release *Storm Warning* in 1994. Johnny Lang covered it three years later on his big label debut album, *Lie to Me*, released the day before he turned 16. Good advice to the young gun and a definite display of how Tinsley gives back to the community for which he lives. Check out this outstanding album with Chuck Leavell (Current keyboardist, The Rolling Stones), Oliver Woods now of The Woods Brothers and the first studio appearance of Derek Trucks.

Tinsley especially wants the readers of the Bluesletter to know how excited he is about John Mayall's new CD slated for release in early 2020, which will include "A Quitter Never Wins" with Robby Krieger (guitarist, writer and founding member of The Doors). Tinsley was born in Atlanta, but the Ellis family soon moved to south Florida where an impressionable Tinsley experienced the blues of The Yardbirds, Cream, early Fleetwood Mac and the legends of the blues. Tinsley distinctly remembers getting to experience a man he emulated, B.B. King. King broke a guitar string mid-song. B.B. changed out that guitar string and handed it to young Tinsley. With the blues already in Tinsley's heart, this incident drove the blues into his soul.

In the mid-70's, Tinsley moved back to Atlanta to further and complete a formal education majoring in history at Emory University. Still in his late teens, Atlanta gave him access to see more blues masters. In his 20's, he learned how to play in front of audiences by playing college parties as well as a summer gig playing outdoors in the blistering Georgia heat at Six Flags amusement park. He credits double-digit daily shows as an early lesson in how to play to different audiences.

Tinsley continued his musical education with a local Atlanta blues band, The Alley Cats. They had opened for some of those same famed bluesmen. Kaedy Kiely, Georgia Radio Hall of Fame DJ and Atlanta music community heroine, shares her feelings about Tinsley.

"I got to know Tinsley when we were students at Emory University around 1980," said Kaedy. "He was a very bright, downto-earth, talented guy who would have been successful at anything he chose as a career. It's truly a joy watching him become one of the world's best as an artist – I'm happy he chose to bless us with his glorious brand of blues!"

Ellis then continued his formal education 90 miles south of Atlanta in Macon, Georgia. There, Tinsley studied law at Mercer University. His musical education continued in a city known for Otis Redding, Little Richard, The Allman Brothers Band and Capricorn Records. After he left Mercer, Tinsley moved back to Atlanta and met old hand blues vocalist "Chicago Bob" Nelson where they formed The Heartfixers.

The community came back around for Tinsley in 1988 where he was signed to seminal blues record label Alligator Records



as a solo artist and released *Georgia Blue*. Tinsley continued his growth as a writer, singer, guitarist and mentor for the next 32 years releasing 20 albums on four record labels, including Alligator, Capricorn, Telarc Blues, his own Heartfixer Music and back to Alligator.

As a career writing and playing The Blues will do, change is inevitable. After six albums in nine years through Alligator Records, Capricorn Records was going through a revival. It was a natural progression for Tinsley to move to Capricorn Records with influences Widespread Panic, Gov't Mule and Col. Bruce Hampton, ret.

Tinsley continued shopping his new albums through two more releases and the magic between Tinsley and Alligator Records came back in 2005 for the release of Tinsley's *Live Highwayman*. The next step for Tinsley materialized as he launched his own label, Heartfixer Music where he released four more albums including the all instrumental *Get It* in 2013.



In 2018, the marriage was on again as Tinsley and Alligator Records again took the blues trail together as Tinsley released *Winning Hand*, and most recently on January 31, 2020, *Ice Cream in Hell*. The title came to Ellis as he thought about how much you see when you're on the road. How hard it can be on the road. That's the hell. "But the payoff is the music. That's the ice cream."

The new CD features 11 songs of raw, guitar drenched experience inspired by B.B., Albert and Freddie King as well as Hound Dog Taylor, Carlos Santa and others. Rolling Stone Magazine describes Tinsley's style, "...feral blues guitar...." *Ice Cream in Hell* debuted #1 on iTunes Blues Albums.

The venue is often overlooked as part of the experience. Consider seeing Tinsley at one or more shows this month. Be part of different musical communities and show your support. These gigs are all short drives apart. See a second show or spend the night and experience the local community. Save the venue's home page as a favorite to check out in the future. Without these venues, there is only busking on the corner or gigging in your garage to ourselves.

March 18. <u>The Triple Door – Seattle</u>, <u>Washington</u>. An awesome venue with a clean and crisp sound system. Seating is

dinner theater style with comfortable tables and booths at different levels. The Triple Door which is in the Mann building that originally hosted vaudeville 100 years ago was repurposed to a music venue meant to connect the performers to the audience.

March 19. <u>The Seasons Performance Hall</u> <u>– Yakima, Washington</u>. This venue, 100 years old, was built as a former church. The Seasons opened in 2005 as an acoustically pure venue in a gorgeous historical building. The staff's goal is to give you the experience of a lifetime.

March 20. Jack London Revue – Portland, Oregon. The Jack London combines the classic speak easy feel in a historic basement Jazz club with the modern bells & whistles of a cutting edge 21st century music club. This Portland music shrine constantly books local, national and international acts giving the music fans a variety of entertainment in an incredibly intimate setting.

March 21. The Capitol Theater – Olympia, <u>Washington</u>. Also servicing the community for nearly 100 years, this is the largest venue that Tinsley will play on this tour to the Pacific Northwest. Reopened in 1986, this more traditional theater seating combines conventional theater service for film festivals and concerts alike.

Going back to Derek Trucks and Johnny Lang, I asked Tinsley about how he gives back to the blues by mentoring other artists. He says he goes out as much as he can to see what music is happening in the local music scenes. When he comes across talented people of all ages who "…have their shit together," this is when he shares some of the lessons he has learned. Tinsley is quick to add that he's learned from them, too. In closing our conversation, I wanted to see who Tinsley thought we should keep an open ear and open mind to. He was quick to suggest both Christone "Kingfish" Ingram and Jontavius Willis. These guys have played the Pacific Northwest. Have you seen them? If not, you heard it. Get your shit together and don't miss them again. Support them. Girls and boys, support the venues they play at. Give to the community and you will get from the community.

Congratulations to this year's BMA nominees

The Blues Foundation celebrates the 41st annual Blues Music Awards on May 7th.

An impressive assembly of blues music masters, ranging from Blues Hall of Famers to rising stars, will gather in Memphis on Thursday May 7, for the 41st annual Blues Music Awards. Presented by The Blues Foundation, the BMAs honor the past year's exceptional achievements in blues music recording, performance, and songwriting, as well as supporting the blues' rich cultural traditions. This celebratory evening, recognized internationally as the blues world's premier event, not only attracts nearly all the nominees, but also presents them in performance.

The event takes place at Memphis' Cannon Center for the Performing Arts (255 North Main Street), where a Blue Carpet will lead to the theater. Doors open at 5:30 p.m., with the ceremony beginning at 6:30 p.m. sharp. Tickets range from individual seats for \$80 to full boxes of 10 for \$2,500 per box, with most seats priced at \$150. All tickets (unless otherwise noted) include admission to the post-show After Party, which will feature additional live performances by nominees, buffet dinner, cash bars, and more festivities. The After Party takes place in the newly renovated Grand Lobby of the Renasant Convention Center, which is attached to the Cannon Center via an indoor walkway.

Topping the list of talented BMA contenders are Rick Estrin and his band Rick Estrin & the Nightcats, with eight nominations. It's a familiar situation for Estrin and the group as they garnered eight overall nominations two years ago, which led to a trio of BMA victories (Band of the Year, Song of the Year, and Traditional Blues Artist). This year, they are again up for their 2018 winning categories along with Contemporary Blues Album (for their aptly named Contemporary). "Kid" Andersen and drummer Derrick D'Mar Martin are in the running for their respective instrumental categories.

Last year's Soul Blues Male Artist, Sugaray

Rayford, is not only attempting to retain that title, he's also nominated for the B.B. King Entertainer of the Year, Soul Blues Album (for *Somebody Save Me*), Instrumentalist: Vocals, and with the Sugaray Rayford Band for Band of the Year, while "Time To Get Movin," penned by *Somebody Save Me's* producer Eric Corne, is competing for Song of the Year.

The Cash Box Kings and Christone "Kingfish" Ingram both are hoping to rule the BMAs too as each act nabbed a handful of nods. Ingram is one of the fastest rising stars in the blues scene, so it's no surprise finding his name in the Best Emerging Artist Album category. Kingfish, however, also has earned nominations for Contemporary Blues Male Artist and Instrumentalist: Guitar, and his album Kingfish is up for Traditional Blues Album and Album of the Year. Midwestern titans The Cash Box Kings are also competing for Album of the Year and Traditional Blues Album (for Hail to the Kings!), as well as Band of the Year. Their recorded song "The Wine Talkin," written by Joe Nosek, John Hahn, and Oscar Wilson, is up for Song of the Year honors, while bandmember Kenny "Beedy Eyes"Smith is among the contenders for Instrumentalist: Drums.

Chicago bluesman Billy Branch also has picked up numerous nominations. His album with The Sons of Blues, Roots and Branches: The Songs of Little Walter, is in the battle for Album of the Year and Traditional Blues Album while Branch is nominated for Instrumentalist: Harmonica, Traditional Blues Male Artist, and B.B. King Entertainer of the Year, where he is facing Estrin, Rayford and Blues Hall of Famers Mavis Staples and Bobby Rush. However well he does at the BMAs, Branch will also be inducted into The Blues Foundation's Blues Hall of Fame the day before the Blues Music Awards along with Bettye LaVette, nominated for Soul Blues Female.

Blues Hall of Fame Class of 2020

Congratulations to this year's Blues Foundation Hall of Fame Honorees.

Bettye Lavette, Syl Johnson, Victoria Spivey, Eddie Boyd, George "Harmonica" Smith, Billy Branch and Ralph Peer will be celebrated as new blues Hall of Famers on May 6th in Memphis. Landmark recordings by B.B. King, Ruth Brown, Arthur "Big Boy" Crudup, Willie Brown, Bertha "Chippie" Hill, and Howlin' Wolf will also receive Hall of Fame recognition at the Blues Foundation's jubilant ceremony in Memphis.

The 14 honorees of The Blues Foundation's Blues Hall of Fame's 41st class encompass nearly a century of music, spanning from 1920s stars Victoria Spivey and Bertha "Chippie" Hill to contemporary luminaries Bettye LaVette, Syl Johnson, and Billy Branch. This year's inductees in the Blues Hall of Fame's five categories — Performers, Non-Performing Individuals, Classics of Blues Literature, Classics of Blues Recording (Song), and Classics of Blues Recording (Album) — also vividly demonstrate how the blues intersects with a broad variety of American music styles: soul, funk, country, R&B, and rock 'n' roll.

The new Blues Hall of Fame performers aren't just exceptional musicians, but they also are educators, innovators, entrepreneurs, and activists determined to leave their mark on the world.

Piano-man Eddie Boyd scored several hits in the early '50s (most notably "Five Long Years") for Chess Records, but the outspoken Mississippi-born Chicago bluesman, dismayed over racial injustice and record business chicanery, left America in the mid-'60s for Europe, where his career prospered for several decades. Harmonica ace Billy Branch, part of the "New Generation of Chicago Blues," is a multiple Blues Music Award winner who also has taught hundreds of blues classes around the globe and is a two-time recipient of the Keeping the Blues Alive

Award in Education. Powerhouse singer Bettye LaVette finally achieved her muchdeserved acclaim in the new millennium after several decades of struggles within the industry, garnering many honors including several Blues Music Awards and performing at President Obama's 2009 inauguration celebration.

Victoria Spivey may be best known to general music fans for including a young Bob Dylan on a 1962 recording session; however, her unparalleled 50-year career began with her breakout tune, "Black Snake Blues," and included her roles as songwriter, manager, bandleader and label owner. Guitarist Syl Johnson (brother of Blues Hall of Famer Jimmy Johnson) starred in Chicago's soul scene during the '60s and '70s. His funky, often politically charged blues-fueled tunes (like "Different Strokes" and "Is It Because I'm Black") have made him a favorite for sampling among hip-hop artists. The enigmatic George "Harmonica" Smith, who played with legends like Muddy Waters, Big Mama Thornton and Big Joe Turner, has been widely hailed by blues aficionados and musicians as one of the premier blues harmonicists, and influenced a generation of west coast harp players.

The revolutionary producer Ralph Peer, 2020's honoree in the Individual (Business, Media & Academic) category, is most associated for his formative recordings in the country music field, but he first did pioneering work in the blues world (including co-producing the Mamie Smith historic 1920 "Crazy Blues" session). Entering the Blues Hall of Fame as a Classic of Blues Literature is Earl Hooker, Blues Master, the insightful biography of the blues guitar giant (and 2013 Hall of Fame inductee) written by French writer/ producer/translator, and American roots music authority, Sebastian Danchin.

Howlin' Wolf: The Chess Box is 2020's Classic

of Blues Recording: Album, the latest BHOF honor for the seminal bluesman. There are five Classic of Blues Recording: Singles receiving Hall of Fame induction: Arthur "Big Boy" Crudup's original recording of "That's All Right (Mama)," later made famous by Elvis Presley; Bertha "Chippie" Hill's 1926 hit version of the oft-recorded "Trouble in Mind"; "Future Blues,"an exemplary example of Pattonesque blues by early-Delta bluesman Willie Brown, and two tunes from the early '50s — "3 O'Clock Blues," B.B. King's first breakout song and No. 1 R&B hit in 1952, and Ruth Brown's remarkable rendition of "Mama, He Treats Your Daughter Mean," 1953's best-selling R&B record.

The Blues Hall of Fame Induction Ceremony, held in conjunction with Blues Music Awards Week, will occur on Wednesday, May 6, 2020 at the Halloran Centre at the Orpheum (225 S. Main St., Memphis). A cocktail reception honoring the BHOF inductees and Blue Music Awards nominees will begin at 5:30 p.m., with the formal inductions commencing at 6:30 p.m. in the Halloran Theater. Tickets, which include the ceremony and reception admission, are \$75 each and will be available starting on Tuesday, January 7, as will Blues Music Awards tickets.

Coinciding with the Induction Ceremony, the Blues Hall of Fame Museum will showcase a number of special items representing each of the Hall's new inductees. These artifacts will be on display for public viewing beginning the week of the BHOF inductions and will remain enshrined in the museum throughout the next 12 months. The Blues Hall of Fame Museum, built through the ardent support and generosity of blues fans, embodies all four elements of the Blues Foundation's mission: preserving blues heritage, celebrating blues recording and performance, expanding awareness of the blues genre, and ensuring the future of the music.

Museum visitors are able to explore permanent and traveling exhibits as well as individualized galleries that showcase an unmatched selection of album covers, photographs, historic awards, unique art, musical instruments, costumes, and other one-of-a-kind memorabilia. Interactive displays allow guests to hear the music, watch videos, and read the stories about each of the Blues Hall of Fame's over 400 inductees.



Karen Lovely is a popular voice on the Blues Scene with many nominations and awards, but it is her heart and passion that come through in her music, performances and the way she lives her personal life. She is intimately involved as a "Domestic Violence Interventionist". She continues to follow her passion to have a personal effect on the causes that she believes touch us all.



That same year, he was also awarded an honorary Doctor of Music degree from Bates College, in Lewiston, Maine. The Hounds of Townsend



John has opened shows for Taj Mahal and KebMo, Maria Muldaur, Ruthie Foster, Marcia Ball, Coco Montoya, David Lindley and others.

Jon Parry (blues violin) by the age of 15 was opening shows for Taj Mahal, Big Mama Thornton, and B.B. King, among others. Jon has performed professionally as a sideman across America, at concert halls, festivals and clubs ranging from the Kennedy Center to the barrooms of New Orleans. He is a long time member of the legendary Goose Creek Symphony. Jon has recorded and performed with artists such as Hank Williams Jr and Danny Barnes.

Sean Divine (harmonica) is a founding member of the Jellyrollers and is one of the premier blues harp players in the Northwest. Sean has several times been an instructor at the Port Townsend Acoustic Blues Festival.

Guy Quintino (acoustic bass) has been a staple on the Northwest blues scene for over 25 years, playing with Mark DuFresne, the Hudson Blues Band, Steve Bailey and the Blue Flames among others. He has been nominated for Best Blues Bass by the Washington Blues Society. Guy also had the opportunity to back up Pinetop Perkins and Hubert Sumlin when they performed at Jazz Alley.



Brian Butler

Blues guitarist, singer and songwriter Brian Butler has long been an established player in the northwest blues scene. Known for both The Brian Butler Blues Band and as a solo performer, he has played countless clubs and concerts, starting out in the days when Pioneer Square and the Pike Market were the centers of the Seattle blues scene. Solo or with his band, Brian's shows feature original songs including "Snow River", "The News About Billy", "Place Pigalle", and "Animule Hall". These contemporary blues range from thoughtful to humorous and have a strong pulse that gets a body moving as well as arousing the mind.

Brian's guitar style reflects his passion for country blues and uptown city styles alike. With his finger style playing, he has mastered the loping blues shuffle. Listen and you'll hear a little BB King and a little Lightning Hopkins mixed in with Butler's



signature licks. Wailing harmonica adds counterpoint to his expressive vocals.

In addition to originals Brian plays audience favorites from the popular blues canon such as "Love in Vain", "Rolling and Tumbling", "Big Road Blues". No show the same!

His latest CD release, *Butler's Blues*, has been nominated as Best Blues Recording of 2019 by the Washington Blues Society and represented the blues society at the 2020 International Blues Challenge Best Self-Produced CD in Memphis. He is also a frequent teacher at Puget Sound Guitar Workshop and California Coast Music Camp.
