


I hope that, with our state slated to re-open June 30th, I'll be able to do more of each of these things that I've missed over the past 14





Points West Virtual Blues Showdown!

Calling all blues artists in Washington, Oregon, Idaho, Montana, British Columbia & Alberta

With the uncertainty the COVI-19 pandemic has presented all of us, the Washington Blues Society in partnership with the Cascade Blues Association, South Sound Blues Association, Inland Empire Blues Society, White Rock Blues Society, Fraser Valley Blues Society, Victoria Blues Society, Edmonton Blues Society, Boise Blues Society, Flathead Blues Society have decided to hold a Virtual Blues Showdown!

This event is open to all bands and solo/duos from the states of Washington, Oregon, Idaho, and Montana and the provinces of British Columbia and Alberta. We are requiring membership in one of the above Blues Societies listed above, which will be verified with each society through their leadership team.

In the spirit of The Blues Foundation's International Blues Challenge we will follow their rules. All acts will have to select either a band or a solo/duo entry, you cannot enter both.

The videos must be shot with a single static camera view from center stage house view (The Judges Perspective), with no editing or special effects, and must be a continuous video with no stops and starts. Videos should be a minimum of 23 minutes, if short of this time metric acts will have one (1) point deducted from their score. Videos should be a maximum of 25 minutes in length, if over this metric there will be one (1) point deducted for each ten seconds over the time limit. The time period starts with the first sound! This includes any introductions or other vocal opening. And ends with the last sound! This includes any closing remarks. Opening or closing remarks are not penalties and should be worked into your set. A big part of stage management and set planning.

This is a "Blues" challenge and music should be from this genre. We recognize the definition of "Blues" is wide and this will be


taken into consideration with all sets. We highly encourage original compositions; however, covers are okay. All covers need to be introduced before starting them and include the songwriter, year released, and if needed who made it a hit.

All entries must be received by the Washington Blues Society by June 15th, 2021 via email at president@wablues.org, or snail mail at Washington Blues Society, PO Box 70604, Seattle, WA 98127. There will be an entry fee of \$15.00 USD, which will be used for production expenses of producing this event. All videos must be received by July 1st, 2021.

We are compiling a number of prizes, and other opportunities for all whom enter this event! So far, we have secured a Harmonica Award sponsored by Lee Oskar Harmonicas, to be awarded to best harmonica player from all entrants. We are working on a guitar award to be awarded to best guitar player from all entrants.

We have secured 20 hours of studio recording time and are working on expanding this for both bands and solo/duos. We have secured paid gigs at Sunbanks Music Festival and are in discussions of multiple other festival events. As we add more, we will be posting them online at our website www.wablues. org, and the Washington Blues Society Facebook page. All of this information and additional items will also be shared with our partners to share on their pages and websites.

Judging will be conducted as per he Blues Foundation's guidelines and this information can be found at (www.blues. org/ibc/scoring.php). First Avenue Blues

Everybody looking for action showed up...

The place to be for blues in the early 1970s in Seattle was the Public Market area of First Avenue. This is the original "Skid Row," a term that originated in Gold Rush days, a place where it seemed the city turned a blind eye to vice in every form.

Everybody looking for action showed up: From the street people to the business crowd in suits and ties. A friend told me that an amazing guitarist was playing at "The Pig," this was Place Pigalle in the Market.

Off we went, and Isaac Scott was playing in the little room at an insane volume. There were beer kegs in front of the tiny stage to act as protection from fights and the staggering drunks. Isaac was fantastic. At one point the drummer stopped; he had fallen off his drum stool!

This was the area where I first played the blues.

We got a gig at Doc's Tavern, which was a half block from the Pig and a bit safer.

In the following months, we played at the Ridge, the Boulder, Smittty's, and other dives-and lived to tell about it. I heard great music from Tom McFarland, David Brewer, Jr. Earl, and many others. I eventually joined Isaac and backed him in a lot of these places.

The Mint featured Little Bill with the great

Joe Johansen on guitar. Little Bill was quite a show in those days, he announced songs of names I cannot print, and he loved to shock the audience. My friends and I still laugh thinking of his antics.

Little Bill often said that "We were out of control."

Bill and Isaac were sometimes tough to be around... good friends acting crazy.

The Boulder, just around the corner from the Market entrance, was truly bizarre. All decked out in red and black vinyl, where gogo dancers in bikinis gyrated to the music.

Our gigs there were Tuesday through Saturday, and I made sure to carry my amp home every night. In those days, there seemed to be no limit to the alcohol served to a customer, and you can imagine how that looked at times. There was a hint of violence in the air, but the club also had meant something special to all of us.

The music was nothing but the blues, and the crowd was mixed, which was highly unusual for that era.

Black, white, rich, poor and nobody cared.

Joel Astley: Designing Sunday Wilde's CD Cover Online!


Earlier this winter, while Canadian blues siren Sunday Wilde was amid putting the finishing touches on her ninth album, Harpdog Brown suggested she reach out to Joel Astley about having him do some album art, and possibly, a collaborative event. Harpdog is a featured guest artist on the CD.

Joel Astley is a Seattle based visual artist and blues musician and he was excited to join forces to create something special. They partnered up to present a world premiere listening party of her new music aired on Facebook live.

People would watch Joel design the album cover art for her new album, Peace in Trouble. This special, virtual event was held this past January, and audience members heard the brand-new album on the show through Joel's art studio speakers, while he penned and painted the design. Joel utilized stylized upright bass, piano keys, clarinet and harmonica, and also incorporated a special harlequin background fashioned after Sunday's purse. The finished cover art is also available as a t-shirt via Joel's Etsy shop.

You can see snippets of the special event on Sunday's YouTube channel. Joel has created a following for his visual art by broadcasting every Sunday evening from his art studio, and he is also known regionally for his work as an award-winning singer, songwriter and harmonica player for the High Note Group.

Sunday Wilde is from Northern Ontario and has released nine albums, garneringworldwide reviews, accolades and radio play, most notably hit #1 on BB Kings Bluesville on SiriusXM and her most recent album Peace in

I had wanted to paint for the last 10 years. It was on a recent trip to Terrace, British Columbia in 2017 that I took a drive to Lake Else Park and met an Artist named Meredith. She was working on a watercolor, and I asked her about painting. She offered to show me some drawing techniques and I came up with a rough landscape sketch. When I got back home to Michigan, I picked up some sketch pads and watercolors and went to work. I soon realized I had no talent for landscapes and decided to try to draw musicians. It was almost immediate that I felt more comfortable doing reference sketches of blues and rock artists. After an excursion to the Art Institute, I started adding more facial details to my work. The colors come from all the great suits that the musicians I worked with more. If I could only dress like



them! And, also my Mom's abstract work. Three years later I have close to a thousand pieces. I have been posting them on the New York Art Gallery on Facebook and have sold about a dozen pieces and have a piece now in England with Stephen Harrison editor of Blues Matters Magazine and with a great Songwriter Dean Bird in Australia. Also, Steven Sharp one of the writers from Living Blues magazine, owns several pieces .I have recently added sketches of trout and legendary baseball players and have sold a couple of pieces of those as well .My artist and musician friend in Seattle, Joel Astley has a drawing of Sonny Boy Williamson I did. The Silver Bow Art Gallery in Montana also recently featured one of my works.

A recent sale was to the well-known Chicago photographer Andrew Steiner, who purchased my Johnny Shines drawing. It has been great therapy to wake up in a hotel or sit at an airport and sketch. Of course, with the pandemic it has really helped with all the gigs that have been cancelled. RIP: Bob Koester

A couple of personal recollections...

During the production of this Bluesletter, a true blues legend passed away, Bob Koester.

I wanted to add a couple of personal vignettes that include my last visit with Bob and his wife at the Chicago Blues Festival several years ago.

I consider myself very lucky to have known Bob Koester on frequent pilgrimages back to the Chicago Blues Festival.

When I first returned to Chicago to cover the Chicago Blues Festival in the early 2000s for both Midwest BEAT and the Bluesletter, Bob's Jazz Record Mart was always on my itinerary.

On my first visit, Bob was changing lightbulbs 10 feet up in the air above the store's entry. He looked down at my shopping basket – it only had two CDs from Junior Wells on his label, and he frowned.

As I walked the aisles, I put three or four more CDs in my basket. Boy, did Bob's mood brighten up!

One of my favorite Chicago Blues experiences was the Sunday blues brunch at Jazz Record Mart. I was told it was a "first class blues brunch."

So, as I made my way from the Hilton on South Michigan Avenue, I thought of Bloody Marys, made-to-order omelettes, Champagne cocktails and chocolates. By the time I reached Jazz Record Mart, I had worked up quite an appetite.

I was hungry after I scaled the ancient building's stairs. I bumped into then-Chicago bluesman Pat Smillie and asked him where brunch was served as Little Arthur Duncan tuned up in what looked like an impossibly small performance space in the corner.

"Eric," Pat said, pointing to the Dunkin' Donuts and coffee at the side table, where Delmark recording artist Tail Dragger held court just a few moments ago, "this is the blues, man. This is a blues brunch."

Over the years, I met Bob at Buddy Guy's Legends and at several Chicago Blues Festivals, and I'll always remember his impish laugh when he asked me about merlot from Washington state as left the Chicago Blues Festival grounds.

"Hey, Eric," he laughed. "Bring some good Washington merlot next trip for me and my wife."



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
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
