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LETTER FROM THE EDITOR



Hi Bluesletter Readers,

Thank you for reading the May Bluesletter. Blues festival season is back, and I am pleased that the 2022 Gorge Blues & Brews Festival returns next month. Check out the festival's line-up and preview in this issue: Too Slim & The Taildraggers, Johnny Wheels & The Swamp Donkeys, the Coyote Kings with Tiphony Dames, the Stacy Jones Band, Michele D'Amour & The Love Dealers, the Robin Gibson Band, Stevie and the Blue Flames,

Seth Myzel Band, Mark Hurwitz and Gin Creek, and the Big River Blues Band.

In my Editor's Report for last month's meeting of the Washington Blues Society Board of Directors, I notified the board that I would serve out the remainder of my current term as Editor and would not participate in this year's election of the 2023 board.

So, my final Bluesletter will be the January 2023 issue, and in the meantime, I'll work with the board to recruit my replacement until the last day of my current, elected term of December 31, 2022.

There are five elected board officers of the Washington Blues Society: President, Vice President, Secretary, Treasurer, and Editor. I encourage all members and readers to consider volunteering for a board position. The elected board appoints the following directors: Music, Membership, Education, Volunteers, Merchandise, and Advertising. The term of each officer and director is one calendar year beginning in January. The blues society solicits nominations, generally, in November and members vote for elected officers in December.

I will work on recruiting your next editor through several channels, including the local chapter of AARP, the Service Corps of Retired Executives, partners at the City of Seattle and King County, a select number of Adobe-related affinity groups, and virtual networks active in graphic design. My skills in the Adobe In Design program are admittedly rudimentary, and I look forward to recruiting an editor with significantly more experience than me in magazine production.

In reviewing this issue during the "deadline dash," I was struck by a few things. First of all, Lee Oskar's cover photo and interior photos from Jerry and Lois Levin capture an exceptional, sold-out CD release show at Seattle's Triple Door nightclub. Lee's CD, Never Forget, was released earlier this year on Holocaust Remembrance Day, and the show honored Lee's family and their experience in the Holocaust. Never Forget is not a blues CD, but it features some of the most thoughtful and memorable harmonica music I have heard in decades.

Secondly, this issue also honors the memory of a Cascade Blues Association long-time volunteer, Greg "Slim Lively" Johnson. I particularly appreciate, and welcome, contributor Kathy Rankin's words and photos. Greg coached me many years ago during my first few years as a volunteer for The Blues Foundation at both the International Blues Challenge and the Blues Music Awards.

May 1st is a special day for the blues in our region. On Ebey Island in Snohomish County, Scotty Harris will host a potluck honoring Lissa Ramaglia beginning at 11 AM, and there will be a Celebration of Life of Greg "Slim Lively" Johnson at the Alberta Abbey, 126 NE Alberta Street, in Portland, beginning at 6 PM.

This issue also includes Jane Henderson's lively review of Junkyard Jane's 25th anniversary, and I found online a cover from 2012 celebrating the band's 15th anniversary (especially with the way Billy reacts to a rather non-traditional use of a wrench). Eric Rice introduces us to his "Maine Connection," and I enjoy reading stories from band leaders and other musicians in these pages.

As I finished this issue, Alcenia's, my favorite soul food restaurant in Memphis, reopened near the end of April. I look forward to seeing owner Betty Joyce Chester-Tamayo's upgrades to her building when I return to Memphis for the Blues Music Awards, the International Blues Challenge, and the Keeping the Blues Alive Awards luncheon this month. I also look forward to cheering on our International Blues Challenge representatives: Bobby & The Two-Tones (band) and Rae Gordon & Brady Goss (solo/duo).

Until next month, enjoy the blues at a festival, club or through your CD (or LP) player. This summer, I'll dusting off some vinyl I bought in college, like XRT Records' Blues Deluxe from Chicago Fest 1980 as well as some LPs from an Eastern Seaboard band that's celebrating 50 years of live blues, The Nighthawks. I look forward to rediscovering these LPs and will write about the experience.

Lee Oskar: An Unforgettable Night of Music

"Some of the most surprising, entertaining, and thoughtful harmonica-fueled music I've ever heard."

This past March, I experienced some of the most surprising, entertaining, and thoughtful harmonica-fueled music I have ever heard. Lee Oskar's first CD release party for Never Forget, welcomed by a sold-out audience at Seattle's Triple Door nightclub, was part history lesson, part remembrance of the Holocaust, but it was an entirely engrossing show with more than a few surprises thrown in.

The line-up of Lee Oskar & Friends featured Owen Thayer on guitar, Mack Grout on keyboards, Washington Blues Society Best of the Blues Chris Leighton Blues Drummer Award-winning Andrew Cloutier on drums, Darrian Asplund on saxophone, and Denali Williams on percussion. Andrew Joslyn and The Passenger quartet joined the band on select songs that also included a visit from Lee Oskar's dog ambling across the stage.

Throughout the evening, Lee played next to sax player Darrian Asplund, and their interplay between harp and sax was a lot of fun to watch. Whether they marched in-step, engaged a call-and-response riff, or just simply complimented (and complemented) each other, Lee and Darrian were exceptional front men.

Never Forget was released on Holocaust Remembrance Day, January 27th, designated by the United Nations on the anniversary of the liberation of the largest Nazi-operated concentration and extermination camp at Auschwitz-Birkenau in Poland. More than 1.1M men, women and children lost their lives at this facility, and the Polish government has supported an archive, museum, and memorial to those who have died since 1947.

The Tripe Door show featured 16 songs that were largely drawn from Never Forget. One of the few departures from the new record was "BLT," inspired by a sandwich Lee ate many years ago at a Denny's restaurant in



California. This romp included touches of slow blues fueled by long guitar and piano solos, and some on-the-spot improvisation that Lee directed with just a nod of his head, or a subtle gesture, to his bandmates. "BLT" was first released as a 45 RPM single by United Artists in Los Angeles, and the flip side features "I Remember Home (A Peasant's Symphony)" co-written with WAR bandmates.

"So Much in Love" and "A Soulful Prayer" were from his 1997 solo release on Zebra Records, So Much in Love. Lee introduced the title tune about love, "which is in its own orbit," and I particularly enjoyed the way Lee and sax player Darrian Asplund complemented in each other in a musical conversation through their respective instruments.

KING-TV's weatherman Jeff Renner joined Lee onstage, and their conversation explored the background behind Never Forget, and Lee emphasized that we all need ways to explore mutual commonalities and,

at the same time, reduce fear. I enjoyed their improvised banter, which was infused with a lot of humor.

Lee talked about the realities of living just two generations removed from the Holocaust. As he remembered his family in Denmark in the 1940s, I thought of many of the wars that have happened in my own lifetime, ranging from the war in Biafra in the 1960s in Africa, conflicts in Cambodia, Kampuchea, and Viet Nam in the 1970s, and more recent atrocities in the Congo, Bosnia, and Rwanda in the 1990s.

While each of these tragedies are important reminders of man's inhumanity to man, the sheer breadth and reach of the Holocaust throughout Europe, was unprecedented, and for many, unimaginable. A CD like Never Forget is important to me for three reasons. First, through Lee Oskar's visual art, CD liner notes and photographs, we remember his family's very difficult struggle in words and pictures. Secondly, this music is deeply personal and relayed with an



uncommon passion and talent and rooted in Lee's own life. Finally, I could not imagine life as a teen immigrant in the 1960s in New York, Los Angeles, and San Francisco, due on part to the protests against the Viet Nam war and a society largely unprepared for a wholesale youthful rebellion against a dominant culture focused on a conflict it could not win in Southeast Asia.

During the 1970s, Lee created what I consider the soundtrack of my teenage years through songs like "Why Can't We Be Friends," "Lowrider," "The World is a Ghetto," "Summer," "All Day Music," and "Spill the Wine" (with former Animal and WAR member Eric Burdon).

Watching songs from Never Forget come alive at the Triple Door was simply aweinspiring. I'm admittedly more a fan than a critic of Lee Oskar's work, because I believe he has created cultural touchstones for the ages in his early work in funk, jazz, rock and blues with WAR, exceptionally creative solo releases and tours, and a musical memoir that looks back and honors his family impacted by the Holocaust.

Yeah, that's borders on hyperbole. Guilty as charged. But songs from Never Forget, such as "Far Away Dreams," and "Miracle Children," each tell deeply personal stories rooted in tragedy and heartbreak, and while some of the evening's songs drifted toward

melancholy and mined the minor keys, Lee made sure that our eventual musical destination tilted toward hope.

After a standing ovation that followed "World for Peace," the band returned to the stage for a single encore. After the drummer and bass player started to lay down the iconic beat, Lee introduced "Lowrider" to the delight of the audience.

The CD release show of Never Forget was an unforgettable evening of music rooted in history and hope.



Mark your calendars now for Friday and Saturday, June 24-25 when Gorge Blues & Brews Festival hits the Skamania County Fairgrounds in Stevenson, Washington. The festival will celebrate 29 years of showcasing musical genius, 35 local craft brew taps, three local wineries, one distillery and mouthwatering food in the spectacular setting of the Columbia River Gorge.

Start your weekend off right on Friday night when all things local are featured from 5 PM to 10:00 PM. Walking Man Brewery, Backwoods Brewing, Thunder Island Brewing and eight other local breweries will be pouring their tasty brews. There will be a nice selection of local wine, whiskey tastings and cocktails. Tons of great food including tacos, BBQ, gyros, pizza by the slice & crab cakes will make the festival tasty. Renowned blues artists will fill two stages all weekend. Admission is \$5 for Friday and comes with a souvenir glass. Saturday tickets are good for Friday & Saturday, come with a glass and some drink tokens. Camping is available onsite, so plan to come early and stay late.

On Saturday, we're opening the gates early for campers for Breakfast, Bloodies & Brews from 10am-2pm. The music starts at 2pm and finishes with gritty blues by Too Slim & the Taildraggers from Spokane. The music will be non-stop on two stages until we end at 10 PM.

Put on your blues shoes on and revel in continuous live blues music filling the air with bands on two stages. This year's line-up is beyond impressive. The music will flow between Riverview Community Bank's main stage and the Big River Grill stage Saturday featuring Too Slim & the Taildraggers, the

Coyote Kings with Tiphony Dames, the Stacy Jones Band, Stevie & the Blue Flames, Michelle D'Amour & the Love Dealers, the Seth Myzel Band, and the Robin Gibson Band. On Friday, we'll have Johnny Wheels & the Swamp Donkeys, Mark Hurwitz and Gin Creek and the local Big River Blues Band.

Admission is open to those 21 years and over only on both Friday and Saturday, no minors will be allowed on the festival grounds. The cost for admission on Saturday presale is \$22 per person and includes a souvenir glass and two drink tokens, \$25 at the gate. Our campers' pass is \$32 presale, \$35 at the gate, and comes with a souvenir glass and four drink tokens. Additional drink tokens are \$6 each, and are good for beer, wine, cocktails, and whiskey tasting flights. Cash or card will be accepted at the gate. 

Great Fun at March Blues Vespers

"This was a great show presented by a great band!"

Iconic Tacoma-based band, Junkyard Jane, continued their 25th Anniversary Celebration, this time at Blues Vespers in March, where they entertained an attentive audience of both old and new fans. Personnel included Leanne Trevalyan (vocals, percussion), Billy Stoops (vocals, guitar), Barbara Blue (bass), Jim King (sax, harmonica), and Chris Leighton (drums), with support from sound technician David Sobie.

With eight albums to their credit. and several solo records by band members, bandleaders Billy and Leanne had a lot of songs they could have played, but the ones they chose represented the band's lengthy history beautifully. Especially appreciated were the many songs of a playful nature, in which a serious subject is up-ended by humor, as when Billy sang, "I'm gonna love you little darlin," In Spite of Yourself," and Leanne's "Love Weighs Fifty Pounds," as she sings "it's bad enough I lost my chef, but did she have to steal my man?"

This performance made it evident that nothing has been lost over the band's 25 years in terms of musicianship and spirit. Leanne's range and honey-toned vocals were spot-on, as was her use of a large selection of percussive devices. "Almost Zydeco," sung in tight harmony with Billy,



featured a brief solo on what Leanne calls a "Trombuzzle."

Billy's guitar solos were stunning and his voice strong, as lead singer and in harmony. Jim King provided thoughtful, sweetly toned solos and flourishes on sax and harmonica throughout the show. The lone cover in the set was Joan Osborne's "Spider Web," which





showcased some nifty stick work by Chris Leighton and a sexy solo by Barbara Blue.

Remembering Greg "Slim Lively" Johnson

March 15, 1959 - March 24, 2022

The world has had to say goodbye to yet another good soul in Portland, Oregon. Greg "Slim Lively" Johnson sadly passed away on March 24, 2022, after suffering cancer, a severe stroke, and a series of seizures. His health issues began on March 23, 2021. Greg was very strong, fought hard, and never gave up. During last November's benefit at the Crystal Ballroom, Portland blues artists gathered together, and there was a lot of love, light and hope for Greg.

"You are life itself without boundaries," said Cherie Johnson, about the loss of her loving husband, Greg "Slim Lively" Johnson. "Blessed and grateful for the life we shared, our endless love, being my best friend, teacher, rock, and compass. Shine that light, my love, on the edge of darkness."

Poignant words from a heartbroken wife and many grieving friends who now must learn to live without his presence. Greg had a well-lived life that ended too soon. He was a gift to all of us and he will be greatly missed.

He was the President of the Cascade Blues Association for many years and was involved in many aspects of the music business. Greg welcomed new artists to Portland, was a friend to many music fans, and Cascade Blues Association members.

Greg was very knowledgeable about music, the history of the blues and knew many details about the artists that played at the Waterfront Blues Festival as well as other blues-related events. In the blues society's Blues Notes, he wrote reviews about newly released CDs and had a special feature, "Ramblings on My Mind."


Greg promoted Cascade Blues Association memberships and was always asking people to join. Besides being a #1 music fan, Greg was artistic, and captured the emotion of many blues artists with his camera.

He engaged in conversation about any music-related subject, and it was always great to spend time with him at blues events. In 2008, Greg received a Lifetime Achievement Award from the Cascade Blues Association.

Greg introduced acts at the Waterfront Blues Festival, Journey to Memphis events, The Muddy Awards, and many benefits. He traveled to other blues events, such as the Blues Music Awards and International Blues Challenge in Memphis.

Blues on Beale Street: Memoirs of the International Blues Challenge, documents this popular Blues Foundation event. The book is a collaboration of Greg Johnson and Jenn Ocken, longtime International Blues Challenge volunteers. The book helps people relive the event through stories shared by the people who were there.

Greg ran the stage at the at Club 152 at the International Blues Challenge in for many years and he always looked forward to it. He also was the Stage Manager at the Orpheum



Theatre for seven years. In addition to managing venues at the blues challenge, Greg also volunteered to judge acts, too.

In 2016, Greg received a Keeping the Blues Alive Award from The Blues Foundation and was recognized at the event's annual luncheon during International Blues Challenge week. In 2021, Greg received the Cascade Blues Association's Muddy Award "Back What You Believe In."

A major part of Greg's life was surrounded by music, but his biggest love was his wife, Cherie

"We will always remember your integrity, intelligence, humor, leadership, and your









Eric's Maine Connection is a remarkable group of musicians from Seattle, Washington. Rooted in the blues, rock, country and R&B, these celebrated players from the Pacific Northwest combine to create their take in songwriting and live performances with the soulful grace that only legends create. Eric's Maine Connection features Scotty Harris on bass and Andrew Cloutier on the drums. Scotty and Andrew grew up in Maine playing music together and made the journey to Seattle just before the turn of the millennium. They are my connection to a mighty freight train groove that is steady as a locomotive "chooglin' on down the tracks" that I think John Fogerty would enjoy.

The credentials they carry is impressive as well working with the top dogs in town like Lee Oskar, Lefthand Smoke among many, many others. They share several Washington Blues Society Best of the Blues "BB Awards" between them, including Scotty's wife, Lissa Ramaglia, who also moved here from New York in the same time frame they did. It probably took a whole oak tree to make all the award plaques. We will miss her and love her for eternity.

Coincidentally (or not), I moved here from Spokane during that same time frame, and Fat James and his crew introduced me to local blues players and local blues scene. From Spokane, I started with Gary Yeoman as my first professional gig. From that, I went on with my band, J.R. Boogie, killing it in the Spokane scene along with Too Slim, D.K. Stewart, Yo & DeCats, and the legendary Joe Johanson mentored me for a time. Talk about a real blues education. After moving to Seattle, I quickly worked my way in. I had the privilege to play with the best players in town. Hanging with these bluesmen and blueswomen forced me to rise to the occasion to compete in this very, very competitive blues market.

Up until now, I really have never been satisfied with what I have created. However, I understand that I really am my own worst critic (like many musicians). Eric's Maine Connection has helped me rise to a level that I can work with comfortably. The trio has also helped me stretch in ways I never thought possible. As a result, I am a very lucky musician.

Jazz is my next target. Wes Montgomery has always been someone I really dig. Joe Johanson had spent some time with Wes back in the day and I am forever grateful that Joe was very gracious in sharing his knowledge with me. I also enjoy jazz songwriters Thelonious Monk and Charles Mingus (great stuff!).


When we perform together as Eric's Maine Connection, it is like a group of guys having an intelligent conversation. We tell the story the tune requires, and not the story our egos tell. Everything I do is well supported by Eric's Maine Connection.

Our new album, *Stuck Inside*, is a great piece of work and it is available on our website along with links to streaming platforms, calendar and Electronic Press Kits.

Stuck Inside is produced, recorded, and mixed by the three of us and mastered by the incomparable Brandon Busch. *Stuck Inside* is a well-constructed album that defines who we are. 

The monthly Washington Blues Society Blues Bash continues with an in-person live event on Tuesday, May 10th at 7 PM at Aurora Borealis, 16708 Aurora Ave North in Shoreline.

The event will feature performances from Billy Stapleton's Powerhouse and the acoustic duo, Chris Eger and Richard Williams. No reservations required and the show is all-ages. As always, the Blues Bash is presented free, and the Washington Blues Society encourages attendees to "Tip the Band" to support the artists.

Billy Stapleton's Powerhouse

Billy Stapleton's Powerhouse is a Pacific Northwest trio featuring the great Don Wilhelm on lead vocals and bass. Don was a founding member of Heart, a mainstay in the Daily Flash, and toured the world with the Paul Allen Band for nine years. Many will recognize drummer and vocalist Steve Peterson from his many years with the Kingsmen and Daily Flash. The trio is rounded out by Washington Blues Society Hall of Fame guitarist Billy Stapleton on lead and slide guitar. Billy plays with the Mark Dufresne Band, Annie Eastwood and has played for Little Bill and the Bluenotes for 20 years. This all-star line up plays a versatile dynamic mix of blues, rock n'roll, instrumentals, soul, jazz, and ballads.

The Chris Eger & Richard Williams Duo

Chris Eger and Richard Williams are veterans of the music scene, with a combined 50+ years of writing, recording, and performing.

Richard has worked with Robert Lang Studios in Shoreline, his own Plum Tree Recording Studio in Stanwood, and performed with Blues Playground and the Lowdown Drifters.

Chris has spent the past 15 years playing and recording with the Chris Eger Band, as well as a number of other acts. During the lockdown of 2020, the duo founded a








The Washington Blues Society's local competitions for the 2023 International Blues Challenge in Memphis have been set! It's time for bands and solo/duo acts to make their plans to compete. One band and one solo/duo act will represent the Washington Blues Society (WBS) in Memphis at the world's largest gathering of blues musicians on January/February 2023 on Memphis' fabled Beale Street.

We are working with Blues Societies across the state of Washington to hold semi-finals across the state to make it easier for blues acts to participate. We will hold semi-finals on: Sunday, June 5th, 2022 in Spokane, WA at the Spokane Valley Eagles; Sunday, June 19th, 2022 in Snohomish, WA, at the Collectors Choice Old Man Brewery; Sunday, June 26th, 2022 in South Tacoma/Centralia, WA at (TBA). Sunday, The finalists will compete in August 2022 in Everett, WA. If we receive 10+ applicants for any event, our Board may select applicants via lottery at the May 2022 Board meeting. This form is an initial statement of interest, and not binding. Judges will evaluate acts using the Blues Foundation score sheet (www.blues.org/ibc/scoring.php).

Each competition will follow the rules of the Blues Foundation. Each set will be limited to 25 minutes, and each competitor will be allowed one 15-minute set change. Any blues act that in resides in WA, OR, ID, MT, BC or ALB, may enter, and the act must include at least one who is a member of the WBS. Membership can be established at IBC entry, using the membership form in the WBS Bluesletter or online at www.wablues.org. Please note: Membership in CBA, IEBS or Idaho/Montana based Blues Society is accepted in place of the WBS membership requirement. The contest entry application may be downloaded from www.wablues.org, or in the May edition of the WBS Bluesletter and must include the non-refundable entry fee, which pays for the backline and a PA system. Each winner will be required to perform at a minimum of two fundraisers in 2022 and one fundraiser in 2023 at no charge. Proceeds from these events and fees, will be deposited into a WBS fund to help defray expenses to get each winning act to and from Memphis, but we cannot guarantee an "all-expense paid" trip. Band entry fee is \$30; solo duo entry fee is \$15. Applications and entry fees must be received no later than Thursday, May 25th, 2022

All proceeds will help with expenses for Memphis. The WBS will help winners in fundraising, but cannot guarantee that all expenses for Memphis will be covered.
