

Blue Moon Marquee Sweeps Maple Blues Awards

Former Washington Blues Society International Blues Challenge Act Wins 4 Awards

When I received the press release about this year's Maple Blues Awards from Keeping the Blues Alive Award recipient Sarah French Publicity, I immediately recognized Washington Blues Society's representative in the 2020 International Blues Challenge in Memphis!

I had lost touch with Blue Moon Marquee and was very pleased that they led this year's prestigious Maple Blues Awards with four wins.

This talented duo played our Blues Bash at Aurora Borealis in Shoreline, and our local International Blues Challenge finals in Snohomish, and each time I've seen them, I've appreciated the way that they have updated traditional blues in their own, unique style. Blue Moon Marquee resonated with blues fans as the band made it to the semi-finalse in Memphis.

The 26th Maple Blues Awards were presented to a sold-out audience at The Harbourfront Centre Theatre on January 30, 2023, with 17 awards going to deserving Canadian blues artists.

British Columbia-based Blue Moon Marquee led with four wins, including Acoustic Act of the Year, Recording/Producer of the Year for *Scream, Holler, Howl*, Songwriter of the Year, and Entertainer of the Year. Ottawa's Angelique Francis won two Maple Blues Awards for New Artist of the Year, and Bassist of the Year.

Long-time blues DJ Patrick Monaghan of Ontario was presented with the Blues Booster of the Year award, honoring 40+ years of promoting and sharing Canadian blues music.

Another esteemed award for a long and illustrious career, the Blues with A Feeling (Lifetime Achievement Award) went to Harrison Kennedy.

The performances at the 26th annual Maple Blues Awards included Meghan Parnell and Dave Barnes of Bywater Call, Kevin Harvey and Neil Elsmore of Durham County Poets, AV (Ann Vriend), Blue Moon Marquee, and Paul Reddick with Kyle Ferguson.

All were backed by the house band and newly signed Cordova Bay recording artists The Maple Blues Band.

The 26th annual Maple Blues Awards were hosted by multi-talented powerhouse Quisha Wint, who also closed the show with a powerful performance.

In August of 2021, I brought five Xerox paper boxes filled with CDs, DVDs, and many International Blues Challenge programs from The Blues Foundation to Gas Station Blues in Issaquah.

Meeting up with Washington Blues Society President Tony Frederickson at this award-winning venue would be a good way for me to donate things I didn't want to move to my new home on Whidbey Island. My new home did not have floorto-ceiling CD racks that my son built in my former home near Mill Creek.

I pulled into downtown Issaquah and had trouble finding a place to park. For me as a fan of live blues music during the CO-VID-19 pandemic, that was a very good sign.

For me not wanting to schlep five heavy boxes of donations several blocks to Tony's truck, not so much. That evening in Issaquah featured Chris Eger.

The area in front of the Gas Station Blues stage was filled, and it was fun to see many familiar faces that I had seen at many Washington Blues Society events.

During the production of February issue, I met up with Bear Drury at Alderwood Mall to donate another 270 blues CDs to the Washington Blues Society. Some of them date back 10 to 15 years, and I received them from record labels, artists, production companies, and promoters.

Some of them are stamped "For Promotional Use Only," and I made sure that each CD package had a CD in it.

At one blues bash many years ago, Mary McPage won a CD package without a CD, but I found an intact CD for her after the show.

Some of the CDs are from record labels

that are no longer in business, such as Excello, Cannonball, or Blind Pig, but there are others from labels that are very much alive, including Alligator, MC-Records, and Severn.

I hope that fellow volunteers Bear Drury and Rick J. Bowen will use these CDs as giveaways at each of our two monthly blues bashes until the last CD is given away.

To start the year off with one Blues Bash in Shoreline and another Blues Bash in Snohomish shows that live blues music still attracts audiences, and I think it's especially important that we seem to be re-emerging back as we navigate a "new normal."

I marvel at how audiences respond to the blues society's free, monthly raffles at Blues Bashes in Shoreline and Snohomish. Most months, Tony or Rick distribute free CDs, and our partners at Seattle's Jazz Alley frequently give the blues society free tickets to some special live shows.


As Tony asks a volunteer to pick the next little red raffle ticket out of a glass beer pitcher, the audience's expectation of winning a free CD or a concert ticket is palpable.

True to blues tradition, Tony has created a new "call and response" ritual when a raffle ticket number goes unclaimed. After calling out the number a third time, the audience loudly exhorts him to throw the unclaimed ticket "back in the bucket."

We are very, very lucky that the Washington Blues Society can host two free live music events every month for members and guests, and I encourage Bluesletter readers to go out to a Blues Bash.

Here is your guide to national acts touring through Washington and the Pacific Northwest this month.

Jonathan Butler

From March 30 to April 2, Southpaw South African guitarist Jonathan Butler will take Seattle's Jazz Alley down to his native Cape Town and explore South African rhythms supporting his latest CD, Ubuntu (loosely translated from the Bantu or Zulu languages as "humanity"). Raised during South African Apartheid, he caught the ear of Britain's Jive Records, but perhaps more importantly, the late Nelson Mandela said that Butler's music inspired him while in prison. Butler's first single was the first record played by a black artist on white South African radio stations (and won a prestigious Springbok Radio SARIE Award, equivalent to a Grammy).

Curtis Salgado in Bellingham

This month also opens with an exceptional opportunity to see Curtis Salgado live in a small and intimate venue and support community radio station KMRE-FM at the same time. Joanne Shaw Taylor, one of my favorite British blues guitarists, is returning to the





Seattle's Got Soul

Simply Soulful Cafe brings live music and soul food to heart of historic Black Seattle

A counter where you can order fried catfish with black eyed peas and yams or chicken wings, greens, and hush puppies. A dessert case filled with sweet potato pie and banana pudding with Nilla Wafers in it. A live blues trio presiding over a small café with paintings of Black musicians looking down from the walls. If you woke up and found yourself here, you could reasonably assume you'd found yourself in a Mississippi soul food joint.

If the place you woke up in was the Simply Soulful Café, you'd be right. You just wouldn't be in Mississippi. You'd be in a newly reopened restaurant and music venue on Jackson and 23rd in the heart of historic Black Seattle, built around the recipes of West Point, Mississippi-raised chef Barbara Collins.

The place was full Friday, Feb. 24, as Barbara and her daughter and business partner Lillian Rambus hosted a celebration of the official Grand Opening of the venue. Wellknown Seattle blues and funk artist Lady A performed for diners as drummer John Oliver III played bass on a keyboard with his right hand while playing drums with the rest of himself and guitarist Herman Brown played clean, beautiful blues licks on a large sapphire hollow-body guitar. Yet despite the crowds and the music, Barbara and Lillian managed to find time to step away and tell the story of the restaurant's origins and their plans for the future.

"In 2014, I decided with my daughter to start selling my mom's sweet potato pie," said Barbara Collins, who moved to Spokane in 1957 and Seattle in 1985 and retired after a 28-year career at Costco. "When we opened, it was just supposed to be a pie, soup, and sandwich place. But after four or six months, we decided to do soul food."



Barbara was well-equipped to run a soul food restaurant. Her mother, who was also a pastor, owned a restaurant back in Mississippi when Barbara was growing up. The soul food endeavor was an immediate success. But the restaurant, then located on Madison Street, was tiny.

Then members of the Vulcan Real Estate group, part of the Paul Allen-founded company Vulcan Inc., told her that the company was planning to build a development on the corner of 23rd and Jackson, and encouraged her to move into a larger space in the new building. The location was significant for Lillian, who grew up in the neighborhood.

"This is a historical corner," she said. "There's a sense of pride being here. It used to be the hub of the Black community. On a Sunday, you'd come from the Tabernacle, you'd go to the deli, to the Red Apple," she remembered with a smile.

The partners were eager to move into a larger space-although the downstairs dining room seats just 65, the old restaurant only seated 20. And the new space has a second dining area upstairs, as well as private party space, and a fully stocked bar.

So, in 2019 they prepared to move. And then, of course, covid struck. It was more than two years before the café could open at the new location. Last August, they had a soft opening, and business has been good since. They managed to get a couple of live music shows in on their new outdoor stage, too, before the weather turned cold.

But they wanted to save the official Grand Opening for Black History Month in February.

Going forward, the owners plan to continue to feature visual and musical artists from the BIPOC (Black, Indigenous, and People of Color) community. The walls are given over to gallery space for BIPOC artists. And live music will feature a wide array of genres, said Barbara. But she favors rhythm and blues, she said.

"That's the music I love and that I grew up on," she said. "And we have a lot of people



that come in that like that kind of music."

Even during the day, Barbara and Lillian emphasize music.

"I bought these beautiful, expensive speakers," Lillian said, gesturing to the house sound system. "We have old school blues, jazz, R&B on all day. And we have Jazz on Sunday all day every Sunday."

For Lillian, it all adds up to an experience she associates with the best parts of life.

"For me, it's a family feeling," she said. "It's good food, grandma's kitchen, eating after church."

For Barbara, the Simply Soulful Café is a place to present the culinary and artistic

heritage of her origins. Right down to the spicy homemade BBQ sauce and the velvety, buttery sweet potato pie.

"Everything we do is related to Mississippi," she said.

You Should Have Been There: The Charles White Revue @ SBE!

"It was the first appearance of the Charles White Revue since 2018!"

In 20 years, I have never seen so many people crammed into the Salmon Bay Eagles in Ballard. Over an hour before showtime it was standing room only. What caused this outpouring of enthusiasm? It was the first appearance of the Charles White Revue since 2018!

For those of you who weren't around back in the day, from 1987 until his untimely passing from cancer in 2010, Charles White was the Crown Prince of The Blues in the Seattle area. Besides holding court over their long-running blues jam in Pioneer Square, The Charles White Band often performed seven days a week at venues throughout Western Washington. James Brown never worked a stage any harder than Charles. He was musical dynamite every time he grabbed a microphone.

I first met Charles and the band in 1997 and was immediately impressed. Here was a blues and soul band that knew how to *rock*. Drawing from the best of the best musicians available, the Charles White Band could go toe-to-toe with any act, anywhere, anytime.

And on Saturday, January 28, 2023, the remaining members did not disappoint. Despite the fact that the six of them had not even been in the same room together in over four years, magic happened. With Scott E. Lind on guitar and vocals, Rolf Larson on keyboards and vocals, Don King on bass and vocals, Ricky Johnson on drums and vocals, Bill Blackstone on tenor sax and vocals, and John Savage on baritone sax, they poured their hearts and souls into it like it was 1999 at Larry's Greenfront. It was as if a time machine had scooped us up.

We could feel the spirit of that short little fireball in the room. The only question was, was his ghost wearing the red suit or the purple suit? It was truly a magical evening. Let's hope it doesn't take another four years to hear them do it again.

But I would be doing a great disservice if I didn't mention the other star of the show.

The show opened with a wonderful performance by the Tim Turner Band. Tim's band has been a mainstay in the Seattle scene for over 25 years. I also first met Tim at the jam at Larry's back in 1997 when he had just formed the Tim Turner Band with Michael Kahler and Lissa Ramaglia, two icons that we sadly lost too soon.

Tim's current band consists of Tim Turner on guitar and vocals, Kim Brusco on bass, Ricky Johnson on drums and vocals, and Nelson Dagget on congas and percussion. They alone were worth the price of admission, performing a tight, one-hour set of standards and originals that showcased the full pallet of Tim's guitar stylings. From jazz to rock to blues, he's mastered it all. It perfectly illustrated why Tim is such a unique guitarist. Look for The Tim Turner Band appearing soon at one of our monthly Blues Bashes.

It was a fantastic night of incredible music.

You Should Have Been There

Walter Trout: A Class Act at Jazz Alley

As a guitarist with Canned Heat and John Mayall's Blues Breakers, I was a fan of Walter Trout before I even knew there was a Walter Trout. As if touring with those landmark blues acts wasn't enough, Walter also has been a sideman for Percy Mayfield, Big Mama Thornton, John Lee Hooker and more.

So to say I was thrilled to be able to see him up close and personal on March 7th at Dimitrou's Jazz Alley would be an understatement.

Since forming his own band in 1990 he has toured the world energizing audiences with his no-holds-barred style of blues. And his latest appearance in Seattle, the day after his 72nd birthday, proved that age ain't holding him back. Walter Trout and his guitar still have a lot of stories to tell. And brothers and sisters, he was telling them loud and proud.

Walter hit the stage running, taking us on a roller coaster ride through a few non-stop numbers before stopping to say "Hello," and allowing us to catch our breath. He then prefaced most of his songs with a brief story about his life and survival. He openly shared insights into his life before allowing his music to show us his soul. And what a life he's had. From growing up and discovering the blues as a boy in New Jersey, to moving to California to hone his craft, to



touring the world, he's seen it all from the top, and from the bottom.

While touring Europe in 2013 he discovered he had liver disease that eventually required a transplant. While recovering from the surgery he was bedridden for eight months and during that time suffered some brain damage. Walter spoke candidly to the audience about that struggle. He lost the ability to speak. To walk. To play his beloved guitar. And he even had issues recognizing his family.

But with the love of his family, especially his wife, Marie, he persevered. Through therapy and determination, he regained the ability to speak and walk. He spent eight hours a day for 12 months, relearning the



guitar. Marie decided it was time for him to get back to work. It seems he was driving her crazy hanging around the house all day. So he locked himself away and wrote 18 songs in two days! Those songs became the album *Battle Scars*.

After surviving an ordeal like that, Walter decided to ease back into performing with a little performance for 5,200 of his closest friends at The Royal Albert Hall!

Since then, Walter has been sharing his stories of life and living with the world as only Walter Trout can. He was emotional when he told the audience that the only reason he was alive was because someone donated their liver. Walter then encouraged everyone in the audience to be an organ donor.

The Walter Trout shows at Jazz Alley weren't just incredible because of the exceptional songwriting talents and heartfelt playing of Walter, but by the rock solid support of his backing band.

To showcase his songs of life and And the surprise of the evening, a very special guest guitarist, a young up and comer named Jackson Taylor Lee, joined the band on stage.

Jackson has a long history with Walter Trout. Jackson's grandfather, Jack Jeckot, taught Walter how to play the guitar and they played together in bands back in their teenage years. Jack is currently the keyboardist for Richey Furay of Poco and Buffalo Springfield fame.

Walter was not shy about giving credit to Jackson's grandfather for his contribution to his success. And now he's proud to be able to pass the torch. Only 25 years old, Jackson has been playing

for 16 years and is already a soulful force to be reckoned with. Besides being the band's gear technician, and occasional tour manager, he joins the band on several songs, playing both electric and acoustic guitars. Let me tell you, he can hold his own.

In fact, he's downright dangerous! This extremely talented young man is living proof that the blues is alive and thriving and that the next generation of blues performers will carry that tradition proudly for decades to come. I predict great things for this gracious young man. Remember that name, Jackson Taylor Lee. Someday soon we'll be scrambling for tickets to his sold-out shows.

After the show I had the honor of speaking with Walter in the Green Room at Jazz Alley. And what a pleasure it was. I have never interviewed anyone nicer than Walter and the band. They are true gentlemen of the blues.

I asked him what he wanted his fans to know about him.

Did he want to talk about the cities on this

tour? No.

How about his multiple Song of The Year and Album of The Year awards? Nope.

About his nearly 30 albums? Nyet.

Or about having yet another song currently in the Top 10 in The Netherlands? Negatory.

He wanted to talk about supporting the British Liver Trust, the Danish Liver Foundation, and Donate Life America, all incredible humanitarian organizations of which he is a patron.

Walter Trout is committed to sharing his music with the world so that the world can share life with each other.

And that, brothers and sisters, is what the blues is all about. Sharing *life*.

And Walter Trout and his band shared his with us.

The Washington Blues Society and the Seattle Peace Concerts are pleased to announce a new partnership to honor Don Glenn's memory and continue four decades of live music in Seattle parks!

For 40+ years, the Seattle Peace Concerts have presented free events in the parks as a mission founded by Don Glenn in 1981 to promote a culture of peace and reconciliation. The Washington Blues Society is the Seattle- based affiliate of the Blues Foundation whose purpose is to promote, preserve and advance the culture and tradition of blues music as an art form since its inception in 1989.

The two groups have worked together for many years as the Washington Blues Society has long been among the concert producers hosting an annual Blues Picnic, as one of the music offerings alongside local producer including Seattle Teen Music, School of Rock, Culture Yard, and Uncle Ron's Band. As tickets to many local music festivals have become increasingly expensive, the Seattle Peace Concerts have managed to remain free and open to the public, operated on a very low budget staffed only by volunteers. The Washington Blues Society will bring in its production team to bolster the and work to ensure its survival.

Past producers Sarah St John, Culture Yard and School of Rock will remain on the board and present their popular concerts. SeaPeace. org is seeking new event producers who can meet select criteria and bring a musical experience to the community and carry the torch lit by Don Glenn over 40 years ago. The 2023 season will include six free concerts in Seattle city parks with two dates open for new event producers to join the Seattle Peace Concerts. Please review the following criteria and respond with a proposal to vicepres@ wablues.org. The new opportunity will remain open until the Washington Blues Society and Seattle Peace Concerts select new producers.

- 1. A bona fide organization with a business license, nonprofit status, school, production company, media producer, association, or community organization with three or more continuous years of operation.
- 2. A non-denominational organization without any political affiliation
- 3. A current and maintained website, Facebook page, or other social media presence.

- 4. A commitment to raise funds to cover a portion of event/concert expenses, including a contribution to the Sea Peace General Fund.
- 5. All event details, including program line up with previews and photos in appropriate formats submitted by all press deadlines.
- 6. Agree to honor the Seattle Peace Concerts' heritage to provide a free concert using volunteers (but, as resources allow, select expenses may be paid to performers via a stipend equitably).
- 7. All producers will not accept any fees or compensation for talent auditions or submissions.
- 8. Follow all City of Seattle Parks Department policies regarding set up, teardown, litter, parking, language, time, volume, land and stage use, (including no fires, or fireworks) and other requirements identified by the City of Seattle.
- 9. Commit to conduct promotions online, mailing lists, print media, and invitations of public free concert (instead of throwing a private party).
- 10. Promote the Seattle Peace Concerts in the spirit of founder Don Glenn, who valued inclusivity, equity, community, togetherness, and a commitment to free music concerts in Seattle Parks Department facilities.
