LETTER FROM THE EDITOR



February marked a year as editor of the Bluesletter, although I've spent half of it on semi-sabbatical, trying to fin sh a dissertation that culminates 10 years of study and a lifetime of dreaming. Last night was the Super Bowl, which barely registered until my dogs started barking at fi eworks in the neighborhood. Apparently, there are some Kansas City fans here-abouts.

I got on X-That-Used-To-Be-Twittter to see who'd won and how the half-time

show was. What I found was a froth of kerfuffl over the pre-game performance of "Lift Every Voice and Sing," which is also known as the Black National Anthem.

That's what made me realize I'd been at this position at the Bluesletter for a year. Last February I set out to write a story on gospel music and since it was Black History Month and rolling up on Martin Luther King, Jr. day, I went to a show in south Seattle honoring MLK. It was a big event with a printed program, and I noted that the choir I'd come to see was going to sing something called the "Black National Anthem." I've spent my whole life trying to know all there is to know about everything, and so I was disquieted to realize I'd had no idea there was a Black National Anthem.

I immediately hit Google and learned that it was written in 1900 as a musical call for liberty, which was a long way from reality for Black people in America at that time. I have studied that period of American history intensely (I have a half-written novel set in the "Gilded Age"), and the horrors of the post-emancipation nation can't be overstated. I'm a musician and a lover of music, especially music from Black traditions, as are we all, as members of a blues society. As such, I can easily understand why a song would be a necessity in those times. Anyone living through that era would need a million of them, and that, my friends, is why we have blues.


It's a great song, too. It helped rally people's spirits through the civil rights struggles of the 1950s and 1960s. Like all music that stands the test of time, it picked up meaning over the years. It gathered historical weight. It is, by any definition, an anthem.

It is an anthem shared by Black people that carries the story of a long, tough struggle through a rough century-and-a-quarter since it was written. It is an anthem shared nationwide. It is, indeed, a Black national anthem honoring a lot of brave people who endured a lot and risked a lot so that their kids could have what all Americans were supposed to have. I don't know how you don't root for that. I don't know how you don't celebrate that. So, naturally, I'm bummed out by the internet foam about there only being one national anthem and if you don't like it...blah, blah, blah. "Lift Every Voice and Sing" pulled a lot of people through a long, long time while the Star Spangled Banner waved over a land in which they weren't as free as everyone else. That's the whole point of progress. To make the words of the offi al national anthem be true for everyone equally. We're working on it, and we always will.

I hit social media again to see Andra Day's performance of the song. It was awesome, with a six-woman choir giving it that passionate, spiritual, traditional sound that I know all blues lovers love. And Reba McIntyre's countrifi d version of the Star Spangled Banner was inspiring too. Two anthems, each honoring a desperate quest for freedom. They both give me chills and remind me that, as MLK said, the long arc of history bends toward justice. It was a nice way to refl ct on all I've learned this year as editor of the Bluesletter.

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Preview: 13th Anniversary of the Coeur d'Alene Blues Festival

The 2024 Coeur d'Alene Blues Festival has an exciting line up that features Special Guest Sugaray Rayford, the Randy Hansen Band, Stephanie Anne Johnson, Robin Barrett and the Coyote Kings with Tiphony Dames, Too Slim and the Taildraggers, this month's cover artist Meghan Sullivan, and six other acts that will contribute to a memorable weekend of music. Here's an introduction to the 2024 Coeur d'Alene Blues Festival performers.



Sugaray Rayford

Sugaray Rayford's most recent album, *In Too Deep*, has taken the music world by storm, clinching two prestigious awards in 2023: the Blues Music Awards Soul Blues Album of the Year and the 2022 Blues Blast Magazine Soul Blues Album of the Year. Following his 2020 Grammy* nomination for "Somebody Save Me," which also garnered him two major Blues Music Awards for B.B. King Entertainer and Soul Blues Male Artist of the Year for two consecutive years, Rayford is now reaping the accolades for his latest masterpiece. (Photo by David J. Corry).

Randy Hansen Band

Randy Hansen is this year's headliner to kick off the Main Stage, a guitar wizard paying homage to the legendary Jimi Hendrix while showcasing his own musical prowess. Although recognized locally in the Inland

Stephanie Anne Johnson

Stephanie Anne Johnson has opened for artists such as Mavis Staples, Robert Cray, The Blind Boys of Alabama, Durand Jones, Cedric Burnside, Black Joe Lewis and even Bernie Sanders at The Tacoma dome. A singer's talent is complete when they can bring a crowded dive bar to a collective hush and also get one of the biggest audiences on the planet to a collective standing ovation. Stephanie Anne Johnson is that special singer. Stephanie has also wowed judges on the immensely popular NBC TV series, *Th* Voice, showcasing their gifts. Perhaps it's no surprise that Johnson is so affecting. Their mantra, after all, is "Find your joy and go there." Their prowess exudes whether they are singing the Black national anthem, "Lift Every Voice and Sing," to a packed

auditorium or whether they're cooing acoustic lullabies to Saturday night tavern regulars.



Too Slim & The Taildraggers

Billed as "straight whiskey blues with a Southern rock beer chaser," Tim "Too Slim" Langford is a monster guitarist and unabashed blues rocker whose influences run the gamut from Lightnin' Hopkins, Freddy King, Duane Allman, Lynyrd Skynyrd and Robin Trower. He is a prolific singer/songwriter whose songs have now yielded an impressive 14 studio albums, 2 solo albums and several live CD's on the Vizztone and his own Underworld Records labels. Too Slim and the Taildraggers are Tim "Too Slim" Langford on guitar/vocals, Zach Kasik on bass/vocals and Chris Reiser on drums/ vocals. Brace Yourself, the new live release, is the latest effort in the evolution of their contemporary blues rock sound and The Remedy their latest studio CD debuted #3 on the Billboard Top Blues Album Chart. Tim "Too Slim" Langford has received Lifetime Achievement and Hall of Fame awards by three Northwest blues societies, and 40+ regional and national awards. Too Slim and the Taildraggers' music has also been featured on MTV's The Real World and Road Rules. Too Slim and the Taildraggers' evolving musical direction cannot easily be classifi d into any category; we do know they flat out rock. (Photo by Carla Ciuffo).

David Raitt & The Baja Boogie Band

David Raitt & The Baja Boogie Band have been headlining shows across the USA,



Canada, and Mexico since 2015. Their distinctive blend of blues, Delta blues, rock, rhythm and blues, and swing has graced the stages of esteemed festivals such as the Calgary International Blues Fest, Wallace Blues Fest, Cerritos Beach Baja Festival, Big Sky Blues Festival, among others. A few Coyote Kings have shared the stage with George Thorogood, Too Slim & The Taildraggers, Curtis Salgado, Sugaray Rayford, Hamilton Loomis, Ian Siegal... the list goes on. Tiphony began with Coyote Kings in 2015, and since then, her infectious energy has helped the Kings wow audiences, show after show. The Coyote Kings w/ Tiphony Dames continue to light up stages across the region. Live Music: Unique Perspectives from the Drums (and keyboard!)

"I feel incredibly lucky that these past few years I have been to many, many fantastic concerts." By Shira Zur

I still remember the afternoon when I asked my mom if I could learn how to play the drums.

We were driving home when I spotted a newly opened music store and popped the question. Hesitantly foreseeing neighbors' noise complaints, I was instead put in piano lessons for a year, until, with enough griping, I dropped piano and started drum lessons.

I began climbing the uphill learning curve every person sets on when they decide to learn how to play a new instrument, but I was hooked. I listened to drummers from Buddy Rich to Chad Smith, observing how others fi d their groove, and I became addicted to the instrument and the sounds it makes.

I'm still addicted, drawn to seeing drummers in their groove, which is why I love live music and live performances. I enjoy the singer, I sing along to the lyrics, but really, in every concert I attend, I watch the drummer, and try to understand how they do what they do (and how I can do it, too).

It doesn't surprise me that when learning to play, I was most drawn towards jazz drumming. It's the genre that is able to communicate another one of my favorite things to do: tell stories.

I chose to study writing because I love storytelling. I enjoy the impact words have on people, whether it be for entertainment, or for a teaching moment, a revelation. When reporting for my school paper, I look to shed light on topics, being granted the immense privilege of having my words accompany someone else's story. And, like the drums, writing is addicting, too; I look for it everywhere, and am always hungry for more stories, books, and articles.

In 2023, I fin shed my second year of college, offi ally marking my halfway point. Looking back at those fi st two years, I see some pretty clear trends.

In my freshman year, I did the freshman thing (the thing everybody told me I would do). But, I refused to agree that I would, until it happened to me. I made lots, and lots, of mistakes. I took classes that I didn't care about, I didn't join clubs I knew I would be interested in, and, like everybody else in my grade, I was messily figu ing things out.

In my second year of college, I looked to course-correct. I focused every minute of my time on journalism, picking up more articles for my paper, taking over our student government beat, freelancing, and interning for a local paper.

Naturally, the second thing people told me would happen to me happened: I became extremely burnt out. I didn't like what I wrote, and felt I was heavily prioritizing quantity over quality.

So, in 2024, I am looking to do neither, but also both – to course-correct, and to make mistakes – but also to give myself grace, to not dwell in every lost opportunity. To be happy with what I am doing, and to let myself rest when I need it.

I feel incredibly lucky that these past few years I have been to many, many fantastic concerts.

My brothers and I went to see local guitarist and singer-songwriter Barns Courtney, whose live performance did not disappoint. I would recommend going to a future concert just for his stage presence

and performance alone, and of course, for his incredible 90's-esque rock sound.

On a similar note, I went to see Paramore at Climate Pledge Arena, which was also a once-in-a-lifetime experience. A big fan of the band, I came in with high expectations, but was still blown away by how lively and energetic their performance was.

On a much different scale, I took my mom

for Mother's Day to see Couch at Madam Lou's. Although it was a lesser-known band playing at a much smaller venue, I was surprised to see the number of Seattle fans singing along to every lyric, making for an intimate and special experience.

Lastly, I must mention my favorite live music experience I have been to so far: watching the Arctic Monkeys at Climate Pledge Arena. I became a fan of the Arctic Monkeys during 2020, a time when I hopelessly felt like I would never attend a live performance again. I would watch YouTube clips of their past live performances, and played along to their songs, like "Fluorescent Adolescent" and "Bigger Boys and Stolen Sweethearts" on the drums almost every day of quarantine, but it wasn't enough.

Albert Cummings






Rick Estrin & the Nightcats

album entitled *Long Way Home*. The Rangehoods were one of the most popular bands in Seattle from 1984 to 1993.



Mike Zito Life Is Hard (Gulf Coast Records)

Mike Zito's new CD, Life is Hard, starts with "Lonely Man," a wide open, good times rocker with Paulie Cerra's gripping saxophone setting the stage for 11 tunes that follow. Life Is Hard showcases Zito's considerable blues chops on which he's built a successful career. The CD, slated for a February 23rd release, features an exceptionally wide and diverse range of blues standards as Mike digs deep into his 45+ years immersed in music. From age five, he fi st was introduced to the guitar, and through his teenage years, raised in one of America's blues cauldrons, St. Louis. His second CD included a collaboration with Cyril Neville on the title track, "Pearl River" which won 2010 Song of the Year at the Blues Music Awards in Memphis. Also in 2010, Mike co-founded the Royal Southern Brotherhood with Devon Allman and Cyril Neville, culminating in a 2014 Blues Music Awards Best DVD, Songs from the Road - Live Germany. Post-pandemic, in 2022-2023, saw the formation and birth of Blood Brothers as a project, a CD, and a tour. Mike, along with Albert Castiglia, formed Blood Brothers and lived the musical dream as artists letting the music and their Gibson and Fender guitars guide them across the globe. The CD, also released on Zito's own Gulf Coast Records, produced by Joe Bonamassa and Josh Smith features 11 tunes that document the collaboration that brings together the Blood Brothers' past influences (which topped

Billboard and iTunes blues charts). Reese Wynans' keyboards and Joe Bonamassa's guitar expertly fuel many of the songs on Life is Hard. . With three original tunes by Mike Zito, Life Is Hard also sports songs by Randy Bachman and Burton Cummings ("These Eyes"), Tab Benoit ("Darkness)," Tinsley Ellis ("Dying to Do Wrong"), Rev. Gary Davis ("Death Don't Have No Mercy"), and Walter Trout ("Nobody Moves Me Like You Do"). Recorded at Los Angeles' Sunset Sound Studio and Nashville's Ocean Way Studios, Life Is Hard is produced by Joe Bonamassa and Josh Smith, (Guitar World honored Smith as one of the top 20 blues guitarists in 2019). Life is Hard is one of those rare and exceptional CDs worth waiting for. History and the present coexist as one as the musicians stretch themselves and meet each other to make an exciting backdrop for a just part of your life. I'm hitting repeat on the disc as I fin sh this review. Kirk Anderson



Albert Cummings Strong (Ivy Music)

I've followed East Coast guitarist Albert Cummings for over two decades, ever since he traded his framing hammer for a Fender guitar. A master builder himself, Albert has received a number of awards for his crafts anship in carpentry and custom homebuilding, and I'm glad that he followed his dreams of being a bluesman beginning in his late 20s. Fast forward 30 years later, after stints on the Blind Pig and Provogue record labels; he's returned to Nashville's Ivy Music Company for his new CD, Strong. The CD features a "fi st call" list of session musicians at Nashville's Ocean Way Studios (also home to Mike Zito's latest CD). Strong features a dozen songs, with two co-written with Grammy-award winning producer Tom Hambridge ("Emmy Lou" and "Lately"), and one classic song from John Lennon and Paul McCartney (Why Don't We Do It in the Road?). I enjoyed the CD, because the songs include not only Albert Cummings-fueled barnburners, but also several introspective, slow blues songs. The CD opens with a solid blues song, "Emmy Lou," that showcases Albert's guitar and Kevin McKendree's piano playing. I was struck by Wendy Moten's powerful background vocals on "Fallen for You," and Albert's strong songwriting chops on the introspectice "Let it Burn" that McKendree bathes in emotional and understated organ fills. While I enjoyed Albert's guitar pyrotechnics, I really enjoyed the slow blues of "Lately" and the slow blues of "My Sister's Guitar." Kenny Greenberg and Bob Britt join Albert on guitar, and Tom Hambridge on drums and Tommy MacDonald on bass can read each other's musical (and rhythmic) minds. Strong is an exceptionally strong rock blues record from start to fin sh. Eric Steiner

On January 28th at the historic Alberta Abbey in Portland, the Cascade Blues Association celebrated another year of blues excellence through its popular Muddy Awards. The show was sponsored by KISN-Radio ("Good Guy Radio"), the Music Millennium destination record store, and Mike Todd's A+ Carpentry/General Contractor company.

I've followed the Cascade Blues Association ever since I first discovered their paper broadside, Cascade Blues Notes, nearly 20 years ago. The publication transitioned to a 12-page PDF three years ago, and I'm pleased that current president Rae Gordon is leading a small, but mighty, group of volunteers to keep blues association moving forward.

Many years ago as a fi st-time International Blues Challenge volunteer, I was lucky enough to work with Cascade's late, long term president, Greg "Slim Lively" Johnson. I often served as a volunteer judge in a blues challenge venue he ran, and other times, we made sure that the right gear got to the right venue at the right time. When not managing blues challenge venues in the evenings, Greg was usually staffing fundraising and raffle tables in the Memphis DoubleTree lobby.

When I was in my fi st term as Washington Blues Society president over 10 years ago, Greg was just a phone call, or email, away, and his experience not only in Portland but also Memphis, was a key part of my blues society apprenticeship. When I was on the Board of Directors of The Blues Foundation for a one-year term representing local affiliates, I'd bounce ideas off of Greg from time to time, and true to "Slim Lively's world view," he'd always ask me: "Eric, how does this help local musicians?"

He never let me forget that.

I am pleased to extend congratulations from the Washington Blues Society to this year's Muddy Blues Award winners of the Cascade Blues Association. I also wish the best of luck to Cascade's newest Board of Directors, led by President Rae Gordon: Vice President Marie Walters, Treasurer Mike Day, Membership Director Mike Todd, and atlarge members Betsy and Clay Clayton and Evelyn Silverman.


